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Narrative report outlining the key issues of the meeting

Dr Ellis opened the January Locality meeting with the sad news of the death of Dr Tom Seddon. The date of the funeral is Friday 24th January.

A minute of silence was observed.

In and Out of Hospital Programme Update

Martyn Kent delivered a presentation giving a summary of the CCG's Commissioning Plans and Intentions. The guiding principles have been linked to 7 priority areas agreed by Wigan Leaders which are linked to the priorities outlined at the November 2013 GP QIPP event. The focus in the initial years will be on outpatients, the high risk of readmission patients and on the frail elderly.

There is a 5 year phasing plan. Year 1 will include major contract variations. Year 2,3, and 4 will address the longer term services with business cases to be implemented in 2015/16

There are to be a series of clinical redesign panels during the initial phases. Each Locality will be asked to put forward 2 clinicians to participate.

GP Deflection Forms

An A5 red card will be given to patients, who have presented at A&E in-hours and who, in the opinion of one of the Doctors, should / could be dealt with by another service, including primary care. The hospital doctor will telephone practices to book an appointment for the patient – the patient will be asked to bring the card with them to their practice.

Medicines Management - Prescribing Data (including antibiotics) and 2014/14 QIPP Plan–

Dr Seabrook presented a paper on potential medicines management indicator choices, highlighting areas of improvement and sharing best practice from individual practices.

Wigan GP PIT Programme

Julie O'Malley joined the meeting to present the Wigan GP PIT Programme (Preventing Infection Together) attached.

Part of JO's role is to look at Healthcare Associated Infections and CQC regulation compliance. The GP PIT programme is a triple programme with an education element which is on offer to all practices and aims to help GP practices to pass CQC inspections. Root cause analysis into episodes of infections will become mandatory. There will be a Borough wide Infection Control Committee looking at sharing best practice and learning from peers.
