<p><u>In & Out of Hospital Services / Nursing & Therapies Review</u></p> <p>SW went through the WBCCG Summary of Commissioning Plans and Intentions presentation, followed by a group discussion.</p> <p>JS mentioned that we have 7 LIFT buildings scattered across the borough and there are lots of opportunities to change and shape the current health care services that are being provided. We are currently paying high tariffs and we now have the opportunity to move and improve services whilst achieving cost savings, this includes moving services out of hospitals and into the community.</p> <p>Presentation Feedback from the group was that services should only be moved if they are to be improved.</p> <p><u>Medicines Management</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> SW went through the Medicines Management Indicator Choices and commented that there has been a positive improvement with this. Antibiotic Prescribing has greatly reduced; Wigan is now at the average for England,

SW asked all GP's present to feedback the results to their surgeries and to also acknowledge that CX's practice have reduced tremendously.

3. SW went through the **QIPP Plan 2014/15** – It is currently being looked at with regard to placing a dietician in practices that will be employed by WBCCG. All present agreed that they are happy for this to be included in the 2014/15 Peer Review. SC suggested that maybe other items could be included in future Peer Reviews as we seem to be getting better and better at prescribing and may end up missing something that could be improved on.
